UPPER BULBOURNE REPORT MARCH 2026

Here are the water table readings for the upper Bulbourne which were taken by Bob Farrer between noon and 13.00 on Tuesday 31st March on a bright spring day. Following the report are Bob's monthly rainfall report for March, Christian Sévigny's garden nature notes and Ned Hunt's most recent observations on Rushey Meadow.

The river continues to flow well through Dudswell, though this month's readings show the water table is now slightly lower than last month. The water is clear, but the increased hours of sunlight have caused patches of green blanket weed to form in areas close to the river source where there is accumulated sediment on the river bed.

WATER TABLE ON 31 MARCH, 2026 by Bob Farrer

Dudswell Bridge – the northernmost datum point

The water table is 1.04 m below datum, a fall of just 6 cm since last month. There is a strong flow of clear water about 40 cm wide and 12 cm deep.



Northchurch Recreation Ground

No reading was possible because the borehole is blocked about 80 cm down.

Here the river is very attractive as the new willow foliage, shown here, looks wonderful set against the sparkling clear water and surrounding cress plants. The flow is vigorous and audible, between 2–5 m wide with a clean gravel bed. The depth of the stream varies from approximately 10–15 cm.

St Mary's Primary School

The water table is 64 cm below datum, 9 cm lower than last month. The rapid audible flow varies in width from 2–4 m and is running over a clean gravel bed. The depth of the stream here is roughly 15 cm.



Billet Lane Berkhamsted – the southernmost datum point

The water table is 1.18 m below datum, which is 14 cm lower than last month. The strong flow of clear water, roughly 15–20 cm deep, is passing through all three under-road tunnels

The fallen tree in the river bed creates a pretty water fall now that the flow is stronger.

RAINFALL RECORD FOR MARCH 2026 by Bob Farrer

A total of 24 mm of rain fell on Dudswell last month, which is almost half the long-term average for Berkhamsted of 47 mm. Contrary to what we might expect, March has been a comparatively dry month in Dudswell in recent years.

There were seven rain days. Several days had dampness and a hint of drizzle but not enough to register in the rain gauge.

MARCH NATURE NOTES by Christian Sévigny

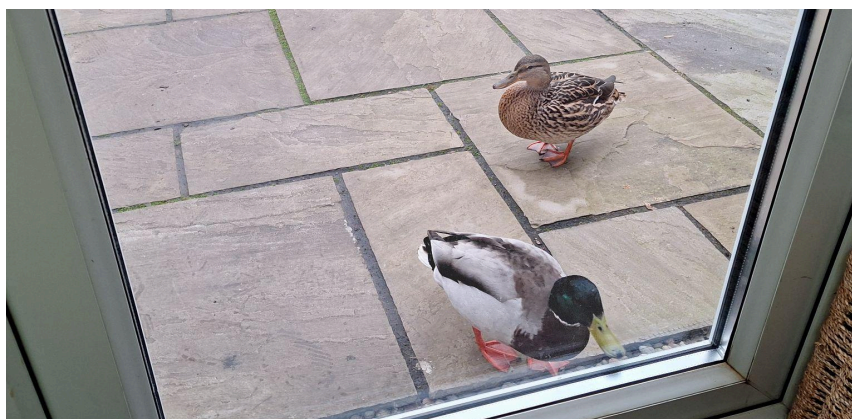
In early March, we were delighted to spot a chiffchaff in a silver birch just outside our window. Its arrival is a clear sign that spring has arrived, and it is always a pleasure to hear its distinctive chiff-chaff song. At this time of year, there is a real cacophony of birdsong throughout the day. Blackbirds, great tits, blue tits, robins and goldfinches are among the familiar voices. We also have quite a few dunnocks taking part in the chorus, as you can see from the one I photographed last week.



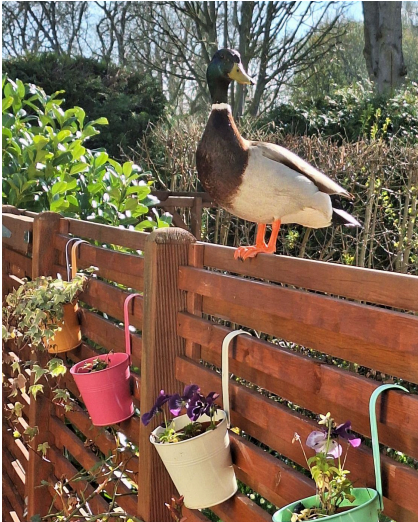
Wood pigeons have been busy eating the remaining hawthorn berries from last year's growth before this year's new leaves appear. They also seem partial to the new shoots and buds of the elder trees around the garden. It's great to see so many trees covered with fresh leaves and blossom again at this time of year. While daffodils have passed their best, bluebells have emerged alongside wild garlic, adding to the sense that spring is well under way. Our mahonias and flowering currant bushes have been alive with bees.



Many birds are now building nests. Magpies have been collecting twigs, often returning repeatedly to the same trees, while rooks have been noisily repairing old nests or constructing new ones in nearby rookeries. A robin carried moss to a nest hidden in an ivy-covered trellis, and a female blackbird carried a bunch of dead leaves to her nest in a leylandii hedge. Birds nearly always use evergreen trees as nesting sites for their first brood, as this offers a well-hidden spot.



Mallards remain among the most frequent garden visitors and are becoming increasingly tame. When they see us in the kitchen, they hurry over in anticipation of food. If ignored, they peer inside, sometimes tapping on the patio doors or wandering around the house to check other windows.



One drake even flew up onto a fence by the kitchen to look in and attract our attention.

When the females feed, the males often stand nearby on watch, taking their turn once the females have finished. I did witness a more aggressive encounter, with one male grabbing another by the wing and refusing to let go. We don't usually intervene in duck disputes, but we stepped in to prevent a serious injury. More recently, females have begun to appear alone, suggesting they are nesting. They arrive hungry, feeding quickly before returning to their nests.

MARCH REPORT FROM RUSHEY MEADOW

Our pond looks rather smaller as I write this, but it's actually much the same level as last month, except there's a lot more water and more grasses, cress and rushes that have greened up the margins. It's now regularly home to two resident Canadian geese that nested last year much farther down the field.

Last week we moved our ewes back up from our bottom field to fresher pasture nearer home in readiness for lambing. At the moment I'm chain harrowing some of the enclosures levelling mole hills and generally scarifying moss built up especially after last year's drought burnt off so much grass.



Over the last few weeks we've had the pleasure of letting our four rams into the new grass field by Hamberlins House. They're only there for a short time before it's closed up for hay later in the summer. I believe this field has been growing cereal crops for over 60 years so it feels special to see animals here now and I think adds to a traditionally managed pastoral setting around Dudswell.
